



Zero Suicide (ZS) in Health Systems Implementation Assessment Options 2026 Fee Schedule

Primary and behavioral healthcare systems in Oregon may be eligible for an assessment at no or reduced cost. Contact info@hsimplementationlab.org for more information.

Option	Cost	Description
OPTION 1: FULL EXTERNAL ASSESSMENT Virtual or in- person	\$14,000	This external full implementation assessment can be a combination of in-person or virtual meetings and data collection. It includes: 1. A launch meeting with leadership and the iLab 2. An in-person or virtual site visit to observe your physical environment 3. Interviews with 2-4 key staff members 4. A customized staff web survey and written survey report 5. Consumer input (web survey, focus groups, or existing data) 6. Document review 7. Generation of preliminary assessment scores and recommendations 8. A facilitated review to finalize the preliminary scores with site leadership 9. A final written comprehensive report that can be used for planning purposes 10. A final written comprehensive report that can be used for planning purposes. If this is a follow-up assessment, the report will be longitudinal and include charts of changes in implementation ratings over time. 11. A warm hand-off to the state Zero Suicide Coordinator, if desired. <i>Additional fees for cost of travel to in-person assessment sites will be negotiated based on location.</i>
OPTION 2: CUSTOMIZED ALL-STAFF WEB SURVEY	\$6,000	This customized all-staff web survey will provide data needed for an internal self-assessment of ZS implementation. Survey questions are directly tied to indicators in the Oregon Zero Suicide Implementation Assessment Tool. The web-survey option includes: 1. Survey questions directly tied to indicators in the ZS Implementation Assessment Tool 2. Customized response options to match the departments, staffing and terminology used by your site. 3. The option to add additional questions (to reduce the burden of multiple staff surveys) 4. A written survey report. If this is a follow-up survey, the report will be longitudinal, showing changes in responses over time. 5. A virtual review of the written survey report 6. A warm hand-off to the state Zero Suicide Coordinator, if desired.

Option	Cost	Description
OPTION 3: FACILITATED MULTI-RATER SELF ASSESSMENT	\$4,000	This facilitated self-assessment will result in a written report of scores determined internally by the site. It includes: 1. A one-hour orientation with site leadership and the iLab 2. An online ZS Implementation Self-Assessment survey for up to 6 respondents or department heads to score themselves 3. A preliminary report of average scores across respondents 4. A facilitated review of the average scores with site leadership to come to consensus around a single self-assessment score for each Zero Suicide indicator. 5. A final written report of implementation scores for each Zero Suicide element and the indicators of implementation within those elements. If this is a follow-up assessment, the report will be longitudinal. 6. A warm hand-off to the state Zero Suicide Coordinator, if desired.
OPTION 4: SELF-ASSESSMENT REPORT	\$1,500	The online option will create an automated report for planning purposes generated by completing a customized self-assessment survey. Contact info@hsimplementationlab.org for a customized survey link.

Additional HOURLY CONSULTATION	\$400	One hour of consultation with the iLab
Travel to Site	Varies by location	Fees for cost of travel for in-person assessment or consultation will be negotiated based on location.
Individual a la carte services from Option 1	Varies by service	Examples: Collection of consumer input, document review, key informant interviews with verbal report

**The Oregon Zero Suicide all-staff web survey includes all questions from the Zero Suicide Institute (ZSI) Workforce Survey and additional questions needed to score the Oregon Implementation Assessment Tool. For external assessments, organizations may provide the results from a recent ZSI Workforce Survey instead of asking staff to complete the survey a second time. In that case, some Oregon indicators might not be scorable unless the organization opts to survey staff again using a shorter survey limited to the additional questions needed to score those indicators.*

Note: This assessment methodology utilizes Oregon Zero Suicide Implementation Assessment Tool (version 2.1), an adaptation of EDC's Zero Suicide Organizational Self-Study.
